11/25-27 — Annual Thanksgiving Trip—Kiamichi River (Directions on page  $\bf 5$  )



## Boquillas Bound — by Marc mccord

A few of us are heading down to Big Bend to paddle Boquillas Canyon on Thursday (Thanksgiving Day) through Saturday. We will depart on Wednesday, November 23, then return on Sunday, November 27.

Six paddlers are committed to making the trip and there is room for up to 6 others (we prefer to keep the group small due to possible competition for campsites along the river and the issue with shuttles.)

We will drive to Stillwell Store on FM 2627, then camp there the night before the trip begins. On Thursday morning we will shuttle to Rio Grande Village and launch, then paddle back to Heath Canyon Ranch, arriving late Saturday afternoon. Our vehicles will be securely parked on the ranch.

After the trip we will return to Stillwell Store and camp for the night before starting for home on Sunday morning. Stillwell Store has basic necessities, as well as hot showers and flush toilets. Gasoline prices in Big Bend are outrageous, so if you can carry spare gasoline and then top off your tanks after arriving there, then you can save a few bucks. BE SURE to top off your tanks before departing Marathon for Stillwell Store!

We can share the expenses of group meals, which will also reduce the load we all carry in our boats, or else everybody can fend for themselves for meals. I prefer the former because it reduces cost and boat loading, but am open to the whims of the group. If we do group meals, then that will include dinner on Thursday, breakfast and dinner on Friday, breakfast and dinner on Saturday with each person being responsible for their own lunches, as well as other meals not included.

There is usually a concessionaire working in the Stillwell RV Park who offers excellent

meals at very reasonable rates, so we do have the options of eating dinner on Wednesday night and breakfast there before the trip starts on Thursday, and dinner there the night the trip ends (Saturday night).

Shuttle costs are (typically) \$65 per vehicle, including driver tip. Sharing rides down there will reduce the per person fuel and shuttle costs.

#### Directions to Antlers, OK and the KRiver Campground from West or Central Dallas

#### Route #1

\*Take US-75 North to Durant, OK

\*From Durant take US -70 East to Soper, OK About 4 miles east of Soper, turn left on US-271 N to Antlers

\*At Antlers, turn left on OK-3 follow for about 1 mile to OK-2

\*Turn right on OK-2 follow for about 8 miles through Moyers, OK. You will see little yellow canoe signs along the road leading to KRiver Campground. The campground is on the right about 1 mile outside of Moyers and is marked with a yellow canoe sign.

#### Route #2

\*Take US-75 North to Atoka, OK

\*From Atoka, turn right on OK-3 south/east to Antlers and OK-2

\*Turn left on OK-2 follow for about 8 miles through Moyers, OK. You will see little yellow canoe signs along the road leading to KRiver Campground. The campground is on the right about 1 mile outside of Moyers and is marked with a yellow canoe sign.

#### From East of Dallas

\*Take I-30 east to exit 101 (TX-24)

\*Follow TX-24 to Paris, TX

\*Outside Paris turn left on TX-286 east/north (this is a loop around Paris to the east) Follow 286 to US-271

\*Turn left on US-271 north and follow to just outside Hugo, OK (beware! there are three speed traps north of Paris in TX at Powderly, Midcity and Arthur City. Speed limits drop from 70 to 50 or 55 abruptly)

\*Outside of Hugo, take the US-70/US-271 bypass (heading to Tulsa north/east)). This becomes the Indian Nation Turnpike a few miles up. Follow this to Antlers.

\*Exit the Turnpike at OK-3 (stay in the right lane at the toll booth, it charges you 50 cents if you are getting of at OK-3, the other one charges \$1.50)

\*From the ramp, turn left on OK-3 and follow to OK-2

\*Turn left on OK-2 follow for about 8 miles through Moyers, OK. You will see little yellow canoe signs along the road leading to KRiver Campground. The campground is on the right about 1 mile outside of Moyers and is marked with a yellow canoe sign.

## Lake & River Cleanup Program



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


